

❖ Pet Insurance

If your pet is insured, we request that you bring your policy details and a claim form, signed by the policy holder, with you on the day at each visit. It is well worth time to check your terms and conditions before you travel. We are happy to assist you with this, as we know how most companies deal with claims.

We will make a direct claim to your insurance company as long as the following criteria are satisfied:

- **The condition you will be claiming for is covered by your policy.**
Some companies prefer that you pre-authorise the claim one week before your visit.
- **Bring a claim form with you *signed by the policyholder*. We will fill it in for you.**
- **Bring documentary evidence your pet is currently insured and a note of the excess. You will need to pay the excess to us on the day.**
- **We do not usually make direct claims to the Kennel Club Healthcare Plan, Animal Friends or Equine & Livestock**

❖ Feeding & Exercise

1. For a morning appointment, do not feed any solid food from midnight the night before. Feeding may interfere with blood tests and anaesthesia we may wish to perform.
2. For an afternoon appointment you can feed solid food before 8am on the morning of the appointment.
3. Do not withhold water from dogs or cats. Water can be given to the point of admittance.
4. Please exercise your dog before your appointment – they are much more comfortable with an empty bladder. We have poo bags if you need them.
5. Please do not allow your dog to go into the sea. A wet dog can chill quickly during surgery.

❖ Day Planning

Most treatments will be performed on the same day. Please allow us at least a half day with your pet - this can mean 3-5 hours unless you have been advised otherwise. If you would like to arrange local accommodation we have a list of pet-friendly hotels on our website. We are aware that some hotels make a charge for room cleaning after a pet stays overnight. We will contact you immediately the procedure is completed. This will give around 45 minutes notice of the likely discharge time. There are a number of interesting places to visit in North Berwick & East Lothian. By Train

Scotrail run direct trains from Edinburgh (Waverley) to North Berwick. These take from 22 to 33 minutes and run every hour except rush-hour when it is a half hourly frequency. Our clinic is a three minute walk from the station. Exit the station and turn left on Station Road. At the crossroads (about 50 yards), turn right down Station Hill and we are the first shop on the right. The timetable can be found and downloaded here:

By Road

Our postcode is EH39 4AS. Our Address is 29-31 Station Hill, North Berwick. **PLEASE NOTE THAT BERWICK-ON-TWEED is about 40 miles from North Berwick!**

FROM EDINBURGH

Access the **A1 or the City By-Pass (A720)** and travel **east** towards the **A1**.

Leave the A1 at the **Bankton Junction** and follow **A198** signposted to North Berwick. This will take you initially to Longniddry. At the roundabout next to the railway station in Longniddry you have two choices.

1. The coastal scenic route sticks with the **A198 and goes through Aberlady and Gullane** following

the coast. Nice views and about 10 minutes longer than the inland route.

2. The direct inland route follows the **B1377 from Longniddry station** roundabout and becomes the **B1345 at Drem**. It joins the A198 at Dirleton. Turn right at the T junction when it meets the A198 and proceed to North Berwick.

Enter North Berwick and drive straight towards the town centre. We are the first building on the right after the second set of traffic lights, approximately 0.7 miles from the 30 mph signs at the edge of town.

At the second traffic lights you will see a sign to the rail station on the right. There is ample free parking at the station (only 100 yards from us) or in either York Road or West Bay Road opposite us.

FROM THE NORTH

Take the **Forth Road Bridge** and follow signs for M8/Glasgow after bridge. At the Newbridge underpass bear left to take the M8 towards Edinburgh. At the **Hermiston Gait junction take the City By-Pass South (A720)** towards Berwick (**A1**). **Follow the A720 to the Sherifhall roundabout and onwards to the A1 (direction Berwick on Tweed). Once travelling south on the A1 leave at the Bankton junction (2nd junction) and then as per the Edinburgh directions above.**

FROM THE WEST

Take the **M8 to Edinburgh** and at the end of the motorway (Hermiston Gait junction), and then as described above in the directions from the north.

FROM THE SOUTH

From Northumberland and Tyneside:

Take the **A1 north**. At **Dunbar do NOT take the A1** dual carriageway but continue round roundabout to the **A199** and follow this parallel to the A1 until **North Berwick A198** is signed. Turn right onto the A198 and follow to North Berwick. **Follow the A198 through North Berwick (signed Edinburgh)** via Tantallon Road, Dunbar Road, St Baldreds Road and Clifford Road. You will pass the **Rail Station** on your left. Just past the station is a crossroads with traffic lights. Turn right down the hill and we are the first shop on your right. Alternatively, park at the station and walk the last 100 yards.

From Cumbria and South West Scotland

Take the **M74 and follow directions to Edinburgh on the A702 via Abingdon and Biggar**. Just past the city limits you need to turn right (**east- direction Berwick on Tweed**) onto the **City By-Pass A720**. Once on the A720 follow directions as for Edinburgh.
